## Congrats to F-M German Students!

The Fayetteville-Manlius High School German Club won a national German music video competition. Their prize? An all-expense-paid trip to Germany for two students, who will be randomly chosen from a drawing for the trip. The winners will attend a Madsen concert and meet the performers backstage.

The students entered a three-minute lip-dub in German to "Laß die Liebe regieren" or "Let Love Rule" by the popular German group **Madsen**. A lip-dub is a combination of lip-syncing and audio dubbing, often filming people in different locations. The video was chosen by the San Francisco-based Goethe Institute from 52 entries and 12 finalist videos, according to **Kate Stewart**, the F-M German teacher.

Thirty-eight German Club members, ranging from freshmen to seniors, participated in the video, which was filmed in one continuous take at the high school. This wonderful accomplishment by the students was lead by German teacher Kate Stewart. Each student had a line in German, depending on their skills, as well as coaching from Kate on what gestures to use.

One of the students, **Keara Lynn**, a senior, noted about the German program that "The program is small, and there is only Frau Stewart. At one point, it was scary when they thought about cutting it. I think this video shows how committed we are to German."

Again, congratulations from the German-American Society of CNY to Frau Stewart and her students for

reinforcing not only their outstanding skills, but also how important the German language program is to our young people!

We will soon be welcoming **St. Patrick’s Day**, an Irish tradition. What about Germany on this festive day? Well, even though it is not celebrated to the extent that it is in Ireland or the U.S., the few Irish living in Germany do celebrate *St. Patrickstag* with their German friends. Many German pubs take advantage of the celebration to sell more beer and whiskey (surprise, surprise!).

In Switzerland, the first Sunday in March is *Tag der Kranken* (Day of the Ill). The Swiss observation started in 1939 when Dr. Marthe Nicati, who specialized in tuberculosis cases, felt that a day needed to be created to further better relations between the ill and the healthy. She also wanted to create a better understanding of the needs of the sick. This “Day of the Ill” is celebrated on the first Sunday in March with visits to hospitals, media awareness campaigns, and a speech by the Swiss Federal President. Each year has a theme to raise awareness and get people out to visit ill friends and family members.
