From the Editor

ince this is October, I thought that the first thing that should be mentioned is **German Unity Day**, celebrated on October 3. This is the date when the reunification treaty was signed between the two Germanys in 1990, following the fall of the Berlin Wall on November 9, 1989.

Now, a little bit about Halloween *auf Deutsch*. Although Halloween is not a traditional German celebration, almost every youngster knows about it. Even for adults, Halloween has become increasingly popular in Europe, and especially in German-speaking countries. It is not unusual to see *Kürbis*, pumpkin, and jack-o-lantern decorations in Austria and Germany by mid-October.

Around Halloween, the Austrian town of Retz holds an annual *Kürbisfest* (pumpkin festival) complete with pumpkins, parties, and a *Halloween-Umzug* (Halloween parade). The area around Retz has become known for its pumpkin festival, which is an event for the whole family.

In Berlin and other large German cities, Halloween has become an excuse for all sorts of parties (like we Germans need an excuse for a party!). In 2008 Berlin's Legoland Discovery Centre decided to stretch out the Halloween celebration for six weeks (now *that's* a party!!!) In the two weeks before Halloween, Berlin school children get out of school for fall vacation, and there are all sorts of parties and excursions leading up to Halloween. There are horror films on TV and in the movie theaters.

Did you know that there is a candy corn connection between Germany and the U.S.? Well, here's how the story goes. Following the American Civil War, Gustav and Albert Goelitz traveled to Illinois to join an uncle who had emigrated there in 1834. After Gustav's death, his two eldest sons revived the
