Now, a little about Erntedankfest: Thanksgiving in German Europe has a long tradition, but one that is different in many ways from that in America. First of all, the Germanic Erntedankfest (harvest festival of thanks) is primarily a rural and a religious celebration. When it is celebrated in larger cities, it is usually part of a church service and not anything like the big traditional family holiday in America. Although it is celebrated locally and regionally, none of the German-speaking countries observes an official national Thanksgiving holiday on a particular day as in the U.S. However, during harvest time, visitors to German churches will find a plethora of fruits, vegetables, sheaves of grain, and baked goods as decorations around the altars. Visitors to market places and fairgrounds will often find an Erntefeuer (harvest fire) and other festivities to celebrate this occasion.

In the regions where wine grapes are grown, Winzer (vintners) will present their new wines and allow for a public wine-tasting. A Bauernmarkt (farmers' market) will allow visitors to purchase the freshest produce available, while the more immediate culinary needs are attended to in a Festzelt (party tent), where it can be assumed that some of the famous German beer will be available." For, after all, what is a German celebration without beer!?
