This month I am writing about *Walpurgisnacht*, which, it is said, was first recorded in Germany in 1668. According to information I found on the internet, this is the night from April 30 to May 1 when witches are reputed to hold a large celebration on Brocken Mountain and hold revels with their gods. Brocken is the highest of the Harz Mountains of north and central Germany. This night is exactly six months from All Hallows' Eve.

Walpurgisnacht is in both parts of Goethe's *Faust*. Walpurgisnacht is also the title of Act 2 in Edward Albee's *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?*

In some parts of northern coastal Germany, the custom of lighting huge bonfires is still kept alive to celebrate the coming of May, while other parts of Germany now call them Easter fires. In rural parts of southern Germany, it is part of popular youth culture to play pranks during this time of Walpurgisnacht.

German Was Almost America's Official Language

According to an internet article by NCC Staff, on April 1, 1789, Frederick Muhlenberg was chosen as the first speaker of the House of Representatives. He was the son of a German immigrant who reportedly founded the Lutheran Church in the Colonies.
