From the Editor

ell, we are just about to observe Father's Day here in America. We celebrate it with cookouts, parties, and giving Dad a well deserved break from mowing the lawn, taking out the garbage, washing the car, and all the other thankless tasks he performs.

In Germany, Fathers' Day is celebrated differently from other parts of the world. There are two terms and/or events of an older origin that, while similar in name, have entirely different meanings. Vatertag is always celebrated on Ascension Day (the Thursday 40 days after Easter), which is a federal holiday. Regionally, it is also called men's day, Männertag, or gentlemen's day, Herrentag. It is tradition to do a males-only hiking tour or day out (sounds like fun, eh, guys?). It's a great chance to pull that wagon filled with beer or wine (according to the region) and traditional regional food, Hausmannkost, such as Saumagen, Leberwurst, Blutwurst, vegetables, eggs, and so on. As men tend to do, they will use this day to drink a little too much and roam the streets singng and carrying on (Now, you don't hear these kind of stories about us, do they ladies?). This action can be very embarrassing to the more conservative Germans who don't participate. One of our members from Germany confirmed that this is the way it was when she lived in Germany. After the men got drunk, it was up to the wives to go and fetch their husbands and bring them home. As much as the children wanted to go along, they were not allowed to see their father in such a state! While in the past a bunch of drunken men may have been amusing, it is no longer viewed as something funny, and Herrentag may not be as widely celebrated on this day as in the past. Besides, German men today hardly need a holiday excuse to have a few drinks with their buddies!

The Austrian Father's Day observance, while closer to the American holiday, is still not exactly the same thing. The date is also in June (on the second Sunday), but the celebra-
