This month I thought I would do something a little different and provide some interesting trivia.

# So, did you know?

- Munich has an opera festival that has been going on for 130 years.
- The *Autobahn* has a speed limit of 85 mph in most areas, but it's not unusual for drivers to average between 100 and 125 in the right conditions.
- The Berlin Wall was built during the Cold War in August 1961 by the East German government under the thumb of the Soviet Union and fell on November 9, 1989, to the cheers of thousands of people in Germany and around the world.
- The first cuckoo clock was built in the Black Forest in 1740 and these clocks have remained a successful export for a worldwide market.
- The highest mountain in the Alps is Mont Blanc, which spans the French–Italian border and is 15,782 feet high.
- The first Oktoberfest was a royal wedding celebration held in Munich on Oktober 12, 1810, of

Crown Prince Ludwig and Princess Theresa of Saxony-Hildburghausen.

- The dropfront on *Lederhosen* was invented in Bayaria.
- Mozart created a lasting tradition of serious German-language opera, followed by other composers like Beethoven, Weber, and Wagner.
- The traditional *Dirndl* dress worn in Germany, and especially Bavaria, Liechtenstein, Austria, and Southern Tyrol, is based on the historical costumes of Alpine peasants.
- Germany's main exports are motor vehicles and parts, along with machinery.
- The lowest elevation in Germany is Neuendorf bei Wilsten at 3.54 meters.
- It is estimated that 406 million people from all over the world visited Germany in 2012.
- And, last but not least, the port of Hamburg is Germany's largest seaport and "Gateway to the World."




