Proposed Amendment to the Constitution and By-Laws

Below is the proposed Amendment to the Constitution and By-Laws of the German American Society of CNY. This amendment has already been proposed and agreed to by the Board of Directors, but a vote of the membership at the General Meeting on January 16 at 7:00 P.M. at the Syracuse Turners is needed:

It is proposed that all annual dues be paid by January 31 of the membership year. If the dues are not paid by that date, an invoice will be sent by the Membership Committee reminding any unpaid member that his/her membership dues are past

due, and that the dues must be paid by March 15 in order to remain a member in good standing. After March 15, any member who has not paid his/her dues will be automatically dropped from membership without further notice. If any prior member wants to rejoin The German American Society of CNY, he/she must come in as a new member.
