The proposed Amendment to the Constitution and By-Laws of the German American Society of CNY was passed unanimously at the January 16, 2014, General Meeting. For anyone who missed reading it previously, here it is again. The amendment will be typed up and provided to members to insert in each one's copy of the Constitution and By-Laws.

It is proposed that all annual dues be paid by January 31 of the membership year. If the dues are not paid by that date, an invoice will be sent by the Membership Committee reminding any unpaid member that his/her membership dues are past due, and that the dues must be paid by March 15 in order to remain a member in good standing. After March 15, any member who has not paid his/her dues will be automatically dropped from membership without further notice. If any prior member wants to rejoin the German American Society of CNY, he/she must come in as a new member.
