From the Editor

ay Day is a time to celebrate the defeat of winter, the welcoming of *Frühling*. *Maiglöckchen* (May bells) are in bloom, houses and dance halls are decorated with young green grass and flowers, and people sing songs to celebrate this joyous occasion. May is the month that is most sung about by poets and songwriters.

In some areas, a whole village may gather around a Maypole, holding hands, dancing, and drinking (is this a surprise?) and happy to not have to work that day. The traditional Maypole dance starts with long ribbons attached high up on the pole. Each dancer holds the end of a ribbon. The dancers proceed around the pole passing right shoulders, to braid the ribbons over-and-under around the pole.

In Bavaria, May 1 is an especially important day. It has been the custom for centuries to cut a tall and straight tree a day or two beforehand, place it in the middle of the village, and decorate it with a wreath of spring flowers and colorful ribbons. One of the traditions is to try to steal the Maypole of the neighboring village the night before and to hold it for ransom, usually a few kegs of beer (could that be??!!). At the same time, the villagers had to make sure their own Maypole was not stolen by their neighbors.
