From the Editor

States, I thought it would be a good time to mention a little about this celebration. The holiday, which celebrates German-American heritage, commemorates the date in 1683 when 13 German families from Krefeld, near the Rhine, landed in Philadelphia. These families subsequently founded Germantown, Pennsylvania, the first German settlement in the original thirteen American colonies. Originally known under the rubric of "German Day," the holiday was celebrated for the first time in Philadelphia in 1883, on the occasion of the 200th anniversary of the arrival of the settlers from Krefeld; and similar celebrations developed later in other parts of the country. The custom died out during World War I as a result of the anti-German sentiment that prevailed at the time.

The holiday was revived in 1983 when President Ronald Reagan proclaimed October 6 as German-American Day to celebrate and honor the 300th anniversary of German-American immigration and culture to the United States. On August 6, 1987, Congress approved S.J. Resolution 108, designating October 6, 1987, as German-American Day. It became Public Law 100-104 when President Reagan signed it on August 18. A proclamation (#5719) to this effect was issued October 2, 1987, by President Reagan in a formal ceremony in the White House Rose Garden, at which time the President called on Americans to observe the Day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

Here are the names of a few famous German-Americans and their contributions: General Friedrich von Steuben, General George Washington's Chief of Staff; Levi Strauss, originator of Levi's jeans; John D. Rockefeller, an American Industrialist and philanthropist; Lou Gehrig, New York Yankee superstar; Charles Schultz, cartoonist and originator of "Peanuts"; L. Frank Baum, author of "The Wizard of Oz"; Lawrence Welk, accordionist, band leader, and famous for *The Lawrence Welk Show*; Conrad Veidt, Hollywood film maker; Fred Astaire, actor and famous dancer; Henry J. Heinz, founder of H. J. Heinz Company; Dwight D. Eisenhower, World War II Commanding General in Europe and U.S. President.

This is only a sampling of famous individuals of German heritage. The contributions of Germans and the German influence is everywhere.
