From the Editor

Sigoes. Christmas shows on TV and carols on the radio started well before Thanksgiving. Black Friday is over and we're trying to decide what to do, what to buy, where to go, and what to prepare for Christmas dinner, among all the other stressors. But it's a great time of year. We get together with friends we seldom see, spend time with our families creating new memories, and share laughs and sometimes shed a few tears for those we miss, and we have holiday cards and e-cards to send.

This is also a time of year to reflect on what Christmas really means and why we celebrate. Sometimes it feels like the real reason for the season is lost in the flurry of shopping, baking, and cooking in preparation for the big day. So, as we prepare to celebrate, let's take a minute or two to reflect on what this event that we prepare for weeks ahead of time means, and what we are really celebrating. I'm sure we have all heard people say that Jesus is the reason for the season.

Whatever your beliefs or background, take the time to celebrate with family and friends, and start by attending the German American Christmas Party on December 13.

I have often told the story of how "Silent Night" came about, and I thought it would be a very fitting addition to my comments for this month.

Assistant Pastor Josef Mohr had written a poem about the night when angels announced the birth of the long-awaited Messiah to shepherds on a hillside. He decided those words he had written would make a good carol for his congregation the following evening at their Christmas Eve service. The one problem was that he didn't have any music to which that poem could be sung, or a working church organ to play the music. So the next day Mohr went to see the church organist, Franz Xaver Gruber. Gruber only had a few hours to compose the music for the poem, but on Christmas Eve in 1818 in Oberndorf, a village near Salzburg, in the small church of St. Nicholas, "Silent Night" was first sung accompanied by a guitar. That carol has become one of the most sung and most meaningful carols of the Christmas season. Many churches light individual candles and turn off the lights on Christmas Eve and for the ending of the service sing "Silent Night" as it was written, in German:
