From the Editor

ust a reminder that October 6 is German-American Day in the United States. The holiday, which celebrates German-American heritage, commemorates the date in 1683 when 13 German families from Krefeld, near the Rhine, landed in Philadelphia. These families subsequently founded Germantown, Pennsylvania, the first German settlement in the original thirteen American colonies. Originally known under the rubric of "German Day," the holiday was celebrated for the first time in Philadelphia in 1883, on the occasion of the 200th anniversary of the arrival of the settlers from Krefeld; and similar celebrations developed later in other parts of the country. The custom died out during World War I as a result of the anti-German sentiment that prevailed at the time.

The holiday was revived in 1983 when President Ronald Reagan proclaimed October 6 as German-American Day to celebrate and honor the 300th anniversary of German-American immigration and culture to the United States. On August 6, 1987, Congress approved S.J. Resolution 108, designating October 6, 1987, as German-American Day. It became Public Law 100-104 when President Reagan signed it on August 18. A proclamation (#5719) to this effect was issued October 2, 1987, by President Reagan in a formal ceremony in the White House Rose Garden, at which time the President called on Americans to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

Now, a little bit about Halloween *auf Deutsch*. Although Halloween is not a traditional German celebration, almost every youngster knows about it. Even for adults, Halloween has become increasingly popular in Europe, and especially in Germanspeaking countries. It is not unusual to see Kürbis, pumpkin, and jack-o'-lantern decorations in Austria and Germany by mid-October.

Around Halloween the Austrian town of Retz holds an annual Kürbisfest (pumpkin festival) complete with pumpkins, parties, and a Halloween-Umzug (Halloween Parade). The area around Retz has become known for its pumpkin festival, which is an event for the whole family.

In Berlin and other large German cities, Halloween has become an excuse for all sorts of parties (like we Germans need an excuse for a party!). In 2008, Berlin's Legoland Discovery Centre decided to stretch out the Halloween celebration for 6 weeks (now that's a party!!!). In the two weeks before Halloween, Berlin schoolchildren get out of school for fall vacation and there are all

Did you know that there is a candy corn connection between Germany and the U.S.? Well, here's how the story goes: Following the American Civil War, Gustav and Albert Goelitz traveled to Illinois to join an uncle who had emigrated in 1834. After Gustav's death, his two eldest sons revived the candy business that he and Albert had founded. The story goes that the Goelitz Confectionery Co. invented the popular Halloween confection known as Candy Corn in the 1880s. Records indicate that Goelitz was making Candy Corn by 1900. That firm's successor, today's Herman Goelitz, Inc. of Fairfield, California, is best known as the maker of Jelly Belly jelly beans.


Syracuse Turners


