From the Editor

November is upon us, which provides an opportunity to thank our armed forces members both past and present for helping to maintain peace in our unsettled world and preserve freedom. Please take advantage on Veteran's Day, November 11, to say Thank You to a vet. Actually, any time you see a vet is a good time to say thanks. You don't need to wait for a special day.

Thanksgiving is the time for us to reflect on the many positive things that have happened to us over the past year and to count our blessings. At many family gatherings before the blessing is said, or one morsel of food is touched, each person at the table, including the children, tell one thing that happened over the past year they are thankful for. It really puts a positive spin on the day, and makes us all think about our many blessings. We live in a free country;

we have a roof over our heads and food to eat; friends and family. And, of course, we have our wonderful German American Society.

Thanksgiving in German Europe has a long tradition, but one that is different in many ways from that in America. First of all, the Germanic *Erntedankfest* ("harvest festival of thanks") is primarily a rural and a religious celebration. When it is celebrated in larger cities, it is usually part of a church service and not anything like the big traditional family holiday in America. Although it is celebrated locally and regionally, none of the German-speaking countries observes an official national Thanksgiving holiday on a particular day as in the U.S. However, during harvest time, visitors to German churches will find a plethora of fruits, vegetables, sheaves of grain, and also baked goods, as decorations around the altars. Visitors to market places and fairgrounds will oftentimes find *Erntefeuer* (harvest fire) and other festivities to celebrate this occasion.

In the regions where wine grapes are grown, *Winzer* (vintners) will present their new wines and allow for a public wine-tasting. A *Bauernmarkt* (farmers' market) will allow visitors to purchase the freshest produce available, while the more immediate culinary needs are attended to in a *Festzelt* (party tent), where it can be assumed that some of the famous German beer will be available." For, after all, what is a German celebration without beer!?

Now a little about a children's procession on *Sankt Martinstag*, just before November 11. Leading up to this day, children can be seen walking in procession carrying candlelit lanterns behind "Sankt Martin" in his Roman uniform riding *Schimmel*, a white horse. Children of all ages sing songs that celebrate the life of Martin of Tours.

The procession often ends up at a huge bonfire, with a snack of a *Sankt Martin Weckman*, a sweet yeast dough "breadman" with raisin eyes and a clay pipe, with hot chocolate for the children and heated mulled wine for the "older" children. Afterwards, some of the children will go singing door to door to be rewarded for the originality of their lanterns as well as their singing with such treats as fruit, nuts, and other treats.

Here is a recipe for *Sankt Martin Weckman* from the Internet:

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup milk
- ½ cup sweet butter
- 3 tablespoons shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons real vanilla extract
- 1 grated lemon peel
- 1 packet rapid yeast (¼ ounce)
- 3 tablespoons warm water
- 4 whole eggs
- 6½ cups flour
- 1 egg beaten with 2 tablespoons water for glazing

INSTRUCTIONS

Mix yeast with warm water and 1 tablespoon of sugar. Combine milk, butter, shortening, and sugar in a saucepan and heat gently, then set aside to cool. Place flour in a large bowl. Make a well in the middle of the flour and pour in yeast mixture.

Cover and let rise for 20 minutes. Add milk mixture to flour and mix all the ingredients together. Knead into a ball, dust with flour, and let rise for 45 minutes.

Roll dough and divide into 10 pieces to form into gingerbread men-shaped *Weckmänner*. Place the *Weckmänner* on a large baking sheet covered with baking or wax paper, making sure to leave enough room between each shape. Let rise for a further 20 to 45 minutes.

Brush with egg and water mixture and decorate with raisins and dried cranberries for the eyes and buttons.

Bake at 325–350°F for 10 to 15 minutes.

Syracuse Turners


