would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has sent a card or made a phone call following my January 8 knee replacement. It really means a lot. I guess I am about bionic now with two hips and two knees! Hopefully I'll be on the dance floor at the Bockbierfest next month.

Many people continue to ask about **Fasching**, so below is a repeat article about the "German Mardi Gras."

Most people would probably say that the Munich Oktoberfest is the biggest bash in Germany. However, it is none other than *Fasching* or *Fastnacht*, Germany's Mardi Gras. This is often referred to as Germany's foolish or silly season. There are thousands of costume balls or dances all over Germany. All events start at 11 minutes past the 11th hour on November 11. Although it remains low key for the first few weeks, the action really gets started seven weeks before Easter.

The Thursday before Ash Wednesday is known as Welber-

fastnacht or Women's Carnival Night. On this day, the women dress up like old ladies and go door to door pulling jokes on people, especially politicians. (Way to go girls!!!) The women are allowed to cut off the tie or kiss (or both) any man within their reach! It is also tradition in many areas for the women to capture the local Rathaus (city hall) and take over the city key. The following Monday is known as Rosenmontag (rose Monday). During this day there are parades and carnival floats. Faschingdienstag (carnival Tuesday) is the last day of Fasching and when most of the festivities happen. Usually workers get the afternoon off to celebrate.

In Munich from 2 to 5 P.M. on *Faschingdienstag*, the *Viktualienmarkt* pedestrian area is turned into a party zone. At night there are gala balls, the biggest held at the Bayerischer Hof. The Bayarians refer to *Fasching* as the "season of fools." Some people dress in costumes and ski down hills. It is a great time of the year to be able to dress up in costumes, act like a fool and have a great time.

Munich also features donuts during *Fasching*. They can be found everywhere! The story goes that in pre-Christian Europe it was customary to choose a man to be the "sacred king" of the tribe for a year. When his year in office was up he would be sacrificed and his blood returned to the soil to ensure a successful harvest. The method of choosing the sacred king was the King's Cake. A coin or bean would be placed in the cake before baking and whoever got the slice with the coin was the chosen one. In recent times the King's Cake idea has evolved into donuts.

Below is a recipe for *Fastnachts* (German donuts), which was given to me by a German friend who is no longer with us. These donuts are usually made on Shrove Tuesday to use up the lard before Lent.

- 1 c lukewarm milk
- 1 fresh yeast cake
- 34 c soft butter
- 2 T sugar
- 6 eggs
- 6 c flour
- 2 t salt

Dissolve yeast in lukewarm milk and set aside. Sift flour and salt into a large bowl. Make a hole in the center and pour the

Mix till no longer sticky. Cover and let rise in a warm place till doubled. Punch down and let rest for 10 minutes. Roll out about ¼ inch thick and cut out the donuts with a round cutter (not the usual donut cutter with the hole in the middle). Let the donuts rise for about 20 to 30 minutes. Fry in deep fat till light brown. Drain on paper towels, then, while hot, roll in sugar. Enjoy!

Friday Night Dinner


