From the Editor

ince March has both St. Patrick's Day and Easter this year, below is a little about each of these.

It is said that we Americans celebrate St. Patrick's Day in a really big way. But there is also a big celebration in Munich. Green abounds to celebrate St. Paddy! Munich's St. Patrick's Day celebration is one of the largest in Europe. (Those Bavarians love a party!)

Irish people and Irish fans or wannabes have been celebrating in Munich since the 1990s. It started out as a small private celebration and quickly blossomed into a large, two-day festival. In 2014 there was a Parade from Münchner to Odeonsplatz. There was singing and an Irish Mass at St. Michael's Church. The Allianz Arena and the Olympic Tower were bathed in green light. I looked up the Munich celebration on Facebook and I couldn't believe my eyes. The number of people who were watching the parade in Munich and celebrating was unbelievable! The crowd was elbow to elbow. I bet the *Hofbräuhaus* was jammed to the rafters. Irish jigs or *Schuhplattling*? Whatever the dance, whatever the beer, whatever the food, I'm sure everyone in Munich will party hardy in 2016!

Now, let's also take a look at how Easter is celebrated in Germany and what German customs have become part of our own celebration. Like many of our Christmas customs, Germany is also considered the birthplace of such Easter icons as the Easter bunny (Osterhase). German children were told of an Osterhase who hid eggs and chocolates for them to find on Easter morning. Immigrants to America, particularly in Pennsylvania, brought the tradition with them and it spread.

Germans also hollow out eggs by making a pinhole in the end of the eggs and blowing out the contents. These eggs are then beautifully decorated and hung from shrubs and trees during Easter week. In some villages, people hold an Easter walk or ride in memory of the walk that Jesus took to his death.

Another unique custom in some villages of Germany is the Easter Fire. For the fire, all the Christmas trees are gathered and burned in a special place, making a huge bonfire, clearing

Friday Night Dinner


