From the Editor

whis month I am featuring a story provided to me by our member **Helene Smith.** It involves the zaniest military impersonation and hoax ever—The Captain of Köpenick.

It seems that there was an ex-convict named Wilhelm Voigt, who lived in Prussia in 1906. He could not find any employer willing to hire him due to his jail time for petty offenses. In desperation, the old man purchased a Prussian officer's uniform at a thrift store and installed himself as commander of a military detachment.

Even though he was only semi-literate, Voigt was bold and blessed with a talent for mimicking the speech and

mannerisms of Prussian officers. So, with all the skill and confidence of a career man, he ordered his troops to board a bus destined for Köpenick, a suburb of Berlin. Once there, he marched the men to the town hall and placed several officials, including the mayor, under armed guard while he pocketed 4,000 marks from the public coffers. No one seemed to notice the shabbiness of his uniform or his upsidedown cap badge.

Unfortunately, his trickery did not last. Ten days later, Voigt was arrested by the police in his garret and was sentenced to four years in jail. By then, Voigt's escapade had made him an international hero, and newsmen and cartoonists called him "the Captain of Köpenick." Kaiser Wilhelm was also amused, and issued a pardon. Voigt retired to Luxembourg on a generous pension from a wealthy
