Back to School in Germany

Ithough I have used this article in the past, I thought that this would be a good time to repeat it as not only is it back to school time, but there is interest in our membership about this tradition and how we might incorporate it into our German American Society events.

Since this is return to school time all over the world, let's take a look at a tradition in Germany that is really a great way to help the little ones going to school for the first time get rid of that first day anxiety. It's done with a *Schultüte* (school cone), or as it is called in some parts of Germany, a *Zuckertüte* (sugar bag), a paper bag in the form of a big cone.

When the children in Germany and Austria set out for their first day in school upon entering the first grade (kindergarten is considered like
