Some revelers in the parade were dressed in traditional Bavarian clothing and wearing a green top hat, suspenders or bow tie. It looks like so much fun. Makes me wish I was going to be there this year.

Places like Allianz Arena and the Olympic Tower are bathed in green light. According to the information I read, there are now more than 50 groups participating in the parade and thousands of spectators. Even St. Patrick marches in the parade. I bet the Hofbräuhaus was jammed to the rafters. Irish jigs or *Schuhplatt*ling? Whatever they do will be a blast! I guess I'll have to go find out. Whatever the dance, whatever the beer, whatever the food, I'm sure everyone in Munich will party hardy! The Bavarians know how to do it up right!
