#### From the Editor

röhliche Weihnachten und ein Gesundes und Glückliches Neues Jahr!

"It's the most wonderful time of the year," as a famous Christmas song says. The Christmas shows on TV and carols on the radio started even before Thanksgiving was here. Black Friday has passed and we are all now up to our elbows in thinking about what to do, what to buy, where to go, what to prepare for Christmas dinner, and all the other stressors that we feel this time of year. But it is also a great time of year; we get together with friends we may not see often, spend time with our families creating new

memories and discussing Christmases that have passed and the people who were there, sharing laughs and sometimes shedding a couple tears for those we miss. We have cards to write and send either by snail or e-mail or Facebook to let people know we're thinking about them and wish them holiday greetings.

This is also a time of year to reflect on what Christmas really means and why we celebrate. Sometimes it feels like the real reason for the season is lost in the flurry of shopping, baking, and cooking in preparation for the big day that began on that cold night in a stable far away. So, as we prepare to celebrate, let's take a minute or two to reflect on what this event that we prepare for weeks ahead of time means, and what we are really celebrating.

I have often told the story of how *Silent Night* came about, and I thought it would be a very fitting addition to my comments for this month.

Assistant Pastor Josef Mohr had written a poem about the night when angels announced the birth of the long-awaited Messiah to shepherds on a hillside. He decided those words he had written would make a good carol for his congregation the following evening at their Christmas Eve service. The one problem was that he didn't have any music to which that poem could be sung, or a working church organ to play the music. So, the next day Mohr went to see the church organist, Franz Xaver Gruber. Gruber only had a few hours to compose the music for the poem. On Christmas Eve in 1818, in Oberndorf, a village near Salzburg, in the small Church of St. Nicholas, Silent Night was first sung accompanied by a guitar. That carol has become one of the most sung and most meaningful carols of the Christmas season. Many churches light individual candles and turn off the lights on Christmas Eve and end the service with the singing of Silent Night as it was written in German:

> Stille Nacht! Heilige Nacht! Alles schläft; einsam wacht Nur das traute hoch heilige Paar. Holder Knabe im lockigen Haar Schlaf' in himmlischer Ruh! Schlaf' in himmlischer Ruh!

Whatever your beliefs or background, take the time to celebrate with family and friends, and start by attending the German American Christmas Party on December 15 from 2 to 6 at the Syracuse Turners.
