And a special Thank-You! to our members who have stepped up and volunteered to chair the various areas for the 2019 Oktoberfest, as well as everyone who has made suggestions on how to make this Oktoberfest a great one. These people have helped the planning move along smoothly so everything falls into place.

As mentioned at our April 19 Monthly Membership Meeting, I contacted the Food Division of the Onondaga County Health Department regarding the baked goods at our Oktoberfest. I was informed that we can sell our own baked goods as long as they are wrapped in plastic wrap and are not cream-filled. According to the Health Department, several festivals do this. Personally, I feel we have some of the best bakers around in our organization for German *Kuchen*, cookies, apple strudel and many other goodies. Doing the baking ourselves should help our profit margin in the bakery and cold kitchen.

The 2019 Oktoberfest mugs will be ready and fully paid for by May 15, and I plan to bring a sample to the May 16 Monthly Membership Meeting.

This year our advertising money is staying in the Syracuse area. All advertising will begin right after Labor Day. The advertising includes the *Post Standard* newspaper and digital version, twice in the Thursday *Weekend Section*, including the *Weekend Calendar*, the *Fall Visitors' Guide*, and the calendar section of the *Fall Guide*. We will also be in all six Eagle newspapers arriving in all area homes, and on the September 11 Eagle cover. There will also be an Oktoberfest ad in the September issue of *Parent Magazine*, that will be done free of charge. We will have half-page ads in the *Syracuse New Times* on September 18 and 25, and will further be available in the digital version, which is free of charge. The Syracuse University *Daily Orange* will run our ads for two weeks, plus one week prior to the Festival. This totals six newspapers running ads from quarter- to half-page. All advertising has been paid in advance.

Two of the bands requested a deposit, which was paid, as well as the printing of the raffle tickets for the weekend getaway, fliers, and membership business cards.

In early July, payment of our Oktoberfest liability insurance, as well as the payment to the Village of Minoa for the Lewis Park Pavilion, the site of Oktoberfest, will be made. Other than this money that will be paid soon, most all other financial obligations have been met and paid. Prepaying most of the bills will enable an Oktoberfest report to be completed soon after the festival, as there will be very few "after fest" bills to pay.

I'm giving everyone all these facts because I wanted to let the members know where their organization's money is being spent and on what.

Now a little bit about a Bavarian celebration. May 1 is an especially important day in Bavarian villages, where it has been the custom for centuries to cut a tall and straight tree a day or two before May 1, place it in the middle of the village, and decorate it with a wreath of spring flowers and colorful ribbons. One of the traditions is to try to steal the Maypole of the neighboring village the night before, and to hold it for ransom, usually a couple kegs of beer (could that be??!!). At the same time, the villagers had to make sure their own Maypole was not stolen by their neighbors.

Another Bavarian tradition is the *Maibaumkraxeln* (Maypole climbing) contest. In many parts of Bavaria, men battle to see who can climb up the shaven and polished tree trunk the fastest, a task made even tougher by soaping down the Maypole. The goal is to win the *Brezeln* and *Würste* (pretzels and sausages) that hang on top of the Maypole, and to impress the girls in the crowd.
