And of course, Munich. Munich may be most famous for its fall *Oktoberfest*, but the springtime *Frühlingsfest* is a city-wide party which is lovingly known as "the little sister of Oktoberfest." The Munich Spring Fair is a two-week event that brings out the entire city to celebrate the warming weather and blossoming flowers. Just as with Oktoberfest, local beers are one of the highlights of the festival, and we can be assured that there will be plenty to enjoy. (Another hooray!!!)

We've spent enough time in Germany that we will be able to celebrate Easter with our wonderful German family and friends. Easter is one of the most popular holidays in Germany. It is celebrated over a long weekend including Friday and Easter Monday (public holidays) with school holidays for the two weeks surrounding that weekend. There is so much for us to enjoy and participate in.

Ostern auf Deutschland is not only a time to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, but also a time for fun and celebrating spring. It is a time for coloring eggs, preparing special meals, and eating chocolate Osterhasen (Easter bunnies).

The homes we visit in Germany are filled with clay bunnies, spring flowers and Easter eggs hung from branches. Children play egg and bunny games. Perhaps we can learn how to blow out eggs and paint them with different colors and designs on Good Friday. We'll then leave the eggs in a basket for the *Osterhase* to find and hide around the house for Easter morning. The children then hunt for the eggs and find not only the eggs, but many times chocolate bunnies and even some presents. Then we go off to church with our German family to celebrate the true meaning of Easter.
