From the Editor

This month I am featuring a very interesting article on the fall of the Berlin Wall submitted by member **Jack Bligh**.

The most significant event of my diplomatic career occurred on November 9, 1989. My wife and I were watching West German TV in our home in Königswinter, across the Rhine from Bonn, then the site of the US Embassy in the Federal Republic of Germany. (I was Minister-Counselor at the American Embassy in Bonn from 1985 to 1992). Suddenly, images of East Germans streaming through The Wall appeared. Surprised? Yes, as was almost everyone else. In the following days, my work brought me in contact with a number of West German business leaders. To a person, no one had expected the opening during their lifetime and I think that I saw a tear or two in the eyes of some. The impact on my work was not overnight, but we would soon add USG commercial operations in East Berlin and Leipzig, and a lot of my work and of others on the Country Team went to ensuring that American companies would have a fair shot at the privatization of stateowned companies in the East.

Not many saw the days leading up to November 9 as the beginning of the end of the DDR, but at least one did. On a Monday evening in late October, 1989, I accompanied Ambassador Vernon Walters to West Berlin. Mondays were the days of the *Wir sind das Volk* (We are the people) demonstrations in East German cities, especially in Leipzig.) The Ambassador, our Minister in West Berlin, Harry Gilmore, and I were guests at a dinner hosted by West Berlin governing Mayor Walter Momper.

During that dinner an aide came in and whispered something to Mayor Momper, who arose and announced that the East German military, which had been prepared for confrontation, had not fired on or interfered with that evening's demonstration in Leipzig. I was seated next to Momper's predecessor, Eberhard Diepgen, who said, "Das ist das Ende der DDR."

Thank you, Jack, for submitting this firsthand account of what it was like being in Germany during this momentous time.
