want to thank the **Board of Directors** for approving the funding for the Scholarship Program. The scholarship applications have gone out to the schools. The completed applications with required documents must be postmarked by March 16 to be considered. The Committee then reviews the applications and the recipients are chosen and notified. The Scholarship Committee members are **John Besten**, **Tammy Gondeck**, and I.

The German Student Scholarship Night is scheduled for Monday, April 25, from 5 to 9 at the Syracuse Turners. The celebration is open to all, with any student of German, regardless of what grade they are in, and their teacher attending at no cost to them. I know I have said it before, but it doesn't seem possible that this will be our twentieth year of awarding scholarships, and I have been fortunate enough to be involved in them all! I have been discussing ideas for something special with the Committee for this great celebration! If you have not already done so, please add this event to your 2022 calendar. It is an evening that showcases our wonderful students of German.

The cost for German Student Scholarship Night will be \$15, except as mentioned above with students of German and their teacher attending at no cost. From the Editor

Ish Wednesday has passed and put an end to *Fasching* in Germany for this year, but let's take a look at what *Fasching* represents.

Most people would probably say that the Munich Oktoberfest is the biggest bash in Germany. But it is none other than *Fasching*, or *Fastnacht*, Germany's Mardi Gras, that takes the prize. *Fasching* is often referred to as Germany's foolish or silly season. There are thousands of costume balls and dances all over Germany. All events start at 11 minutes past the 11th hour on November 11. Although it remains low key for the first few weeks, the action really gets started seven weeks before Easter.

The Thursday before Ash Wednesday is known as *Welberfastnacht*, or Women's Carnival Night, when women dress up like old ladies and go door to door pranking people, especially politicians. (Way to go girls!!!) They're allowed to cut off the tie of or kiss (or both) any man! (I've heard that one of the German teachers in our area is great at tie-cutting!) It's also tradition in many areas for women to capture the local *Rathaus* (city hall) and take over the city key. The following Monday is known as *Rosenmontag* (Rose Monday). During this day there are parades and carnival floats. *Faschingdienstag* (Carnival Tuesday) is the last day of *Fasching* and when most of the festivities happen. Usually, workers get the afternoon off to celebrate.

In Munich from 2 to 5 P,M. on *Faschingdienstag* the *Viktualienmarkt* pedestrian area is turned into a party zone. At night there are gala balls, the biggest held at the *Bayerischer Hof.* The Bavarians refer to *Fasching* as the "season of fools." Some people dress in costumes and ski down hills. It is a great time of the year to be able to dress up in costumes, act like a fool, and have a great time.

Also, we will soon be welcoming St. Patrick's Day, an Irish tradition. What about Germany on this festive day? Well, it is not celebrated to the extent that it is in Ireland or the U.S., but the Irish living in Germany do celebrate *St. Patrickstag* with their German friends. After all, isn't everyone Irish on St. Patrick's Day? Many German pubs take advantage of the celebration to sell more beer and whiskey. (I'm sure there's no problem with that!)

March is special in Switzerland where the first Sunday in March is *Tag der Kranken* (day of the ill). The Swiss observation started in 1939 when Dr. Marthe Nicati, who specialized in tuberculosis cases, felt that a day needed to be created to further better relations between the ill and the healthy. She also wanted to create a better understanding of the needs of the sick. This "Day of the Ill" is celebrated on the first Sunday in March with visits to hospitals, media awareness campaigns, and a speech by the Swiss Federal President. Each year has a theme to raise awareness and get people out to visit ill friends and family members.

Why don't we all observe this *Tag der Kranken*, not just for one day, but whenever we hear about a sick friend or family member? A card, phone call, or visit really cheers up an ill or recuperating person.


