When the Viennese decide to go to the *Heuriger*, they are patronizing a very traditional place with a small gathering of family and friends. This is quite in contrast to the well-known Bavarian Oktoberfest which is full of lively music and many people. At *Heuriger* one is looking for a

Normally a patron orders two pints of golden grape and asks for some small glasses to be handed out among guests. Food always partners with the wine so that the danger of getting drunk is slight, although after drinking a half pint of the good wine one may get a little buzz on, as we would say here in America. The Viennese refer to this good feeling as an *Achterl* or a *Vierterl* (an eighth or a quarter of a liter). Understandably, anybody situated around a rustic table with wooden benches will shed any form of shyness and enjoy a carefree conversation about "God and the world," as the German expression goes.

Adults most often go to the *Heuriger* after work, although on weekends they take their children, who play while their parents relax at the table. People alternate venues as the year goes on as the winegrowers serve their wine only as long as it lasts, usually two to four weeks. To indicate what they are serving, the winemakers hang a pine wreath above the farm's entrance. It shows red light for red wine and white light for white wine, or in some instances both lights. More white wine is produced in the area of Vienna, the *Grüner Veltliner* being the grape of choice. It is not sweet like *Riesling*, but more acidic and very pleasing to the taste buds.

The *Heurigen* tradition was introduced by Franconian and Bavarian peasants who settled in the area from the 12th century forward, when the Danube Valley was occupied by the Germans. The Germans defended it against the Slavic and Hungarian adversaries. Over the years, enemies became friends and continued the traditions, and even started growing grapes. Some people conclude that the wineries contributed to the region's peaceful atmosphere of good food, great regional wine, and traditional music, usually played by a quartet, with an occasional female vocalist.

Since the end of World War II, the region has become a tourist destination, with people wanting to feel the intimate, family-oriented experience. When busloads of tourists converge on these regions, the intimate mood for family and friends may no longer be present. However, if German *Gemütlichkeit* is properly applied, the *Heurigen* experience may still be there.

Historically, Vienna developed the *Heuriger* tradition due to being the center during the Holy Roman Empire and forward. Over the centuries the government ensured that diplomatic guests could destress at one of these peaceful venues. After the war, when members of various allied troops, American, British, French, or Soviet were invited to the *Heurigen*, after one or two glasses of wine differences were almost eliminated.
