## Proposed Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws

s the January meetings were canceled due to the horrible weather forecast, the following proposed amendments to our Constitution and By-Laws will be presented and voted on at the February 16 Membership Meeting at the Syracuse Turners at 7 P.M. Please attend this very important meeting to vote on whether to accept these amendments.

*Under Article 5—Membership, Sec. 5—Expulsion, Sub. (1)—Motion to expel:* 

**Delete:** "Members whose dues are in arrears for twelve consecutive months after previous demand by the Secretary to pay shall lose their membership automatically."

Rationale: Article 6—Officers, Sec. 1—Duties of Officers, Sub. (4) Finance Secretary already says that "Members who do not pay their dues by March 15 will automatically be terminated without further notice." So, the sentence in Article 5 that is proposed to be deleted is contradictory and redundant.

**Under Article 8-Elections:** 

In the fourth paragraph **delete** "All officers and directors are exempt from dues and may succeed themselves in following elections" and **substitute** "Therefore all officers and directors may succeed themselves in following elections, if nominated in accordance with this article."

**Rationale:** This was discussed when the dues structure was modified in 2020. Most officers and directors already pay dues voluntarily, and given the financial status of the organization, it doesn't make sense to exempt 15 of our approximately 160+ members from paying dues.

## From the Editor

any people continue to ask about *Fasching*, so below is a repeat article about the "German Mardi Gras."

Most people would probably say that the Munich Oktoberfest is the biggest bash in Germany. However, it is none other than

Fasching or Fastnacht, Germany's Mardi Gras. This is often referred to as Germany's foolish or silly season. There are thousands of costume balls or dances all over Germany. All events start at 11 minutes past the 11th hour on November 11th. Although it remains low key for the first few weeks, the action really gets started seven weeks before Easter.

The Thursday before Ash Wednesday is known as *Welberfast-nach* or Women's Carnival Night. On this day, the women dress up like old ladies and go door to door, pulling jokes on people, especially politicians. (Way to go girls!!!) The women are allowed to cut off the tie or kiss (or both) any man within their reach! It is also tradition in many areas for the women to capture the local *Rathaus* (city hall) and take over the city key. The following Monday is known as *Rosenmontag* (Rose Monday). During this day there are parades and carnival floats. *Faschingdienstag* (Carnival Tuesday) is the last day of *Fasching* and when most of the festivities happen. Usually workers get the afternoon off to celebrate.

In Munich from 2 to 5 P.M. on *Faschingdienstag*, the *Viktualienmarkt* pedestrian area is turned into a party zone. At night there are gala balls, the biggest held at the *Bayerischer Hof*. The Bavarians refer to *Fasching* as the "season of fools." Some people dress in costumes and ski down hills. It is a great time of the year to be able to dress up in costumes, act like a fool and have a great time.

Munich also features donuts during *Fashing*. They can be found everywhere! The story goes that in pre-Christian Europe it was customary to choose a man to be the "sacred king" of the tribe for a year. When his year in office was up he would be sacrificed and his blood returned to the soil to ensure a successful harvest. The method of choosing the sacred king was the King's Cake. A coin or bean would be placed in the cake before baking

and whoever got the slice with the coin was the chosen one. In recent times the King's Cake idea has evolved into donuts.

Below is a recipe for *Fastnachts* (German donuts) which was given to me by a German friend who is no longer with us. These donuts are usually made on Shrove Tuesday to use up the lard before Lent.

1 cup lukewarm milk

1 fresh yeast cake

34 cup soft butter

2 tbsps sugar

6 eggs

6 cups flour

2 tsps salt

Dissolve yeast in lukewarm milk and set aside. Sift flour and salt into a large bowl. Make a hole in the center and pour the dissolved yeast and all other ingredients into the hole. Mix till no longer sticky. Cover and let rise in a warm place till doubled. Punch down and let rest for 10 minutes. Roll out about ¼-inch thick and cut out the donuts with a round cutter (not usually the regular donut cutter with the hole in the middle) or cut in the traditional diamond shape with a slit down the middle. Let the donuts rise for about 20 to 30 minutes. Fry in deep fat till light brown. Drain on paper towels, then, while hot, roll in sugar. Enjoy!

Next month I will include a recipe for German Apple Cake that has been given to me by one of our members.
