

When people think about large beer festivals in Germany, the first thing that pops up is Munich's Oktoberfest. However, the Berliner Bierfestival that takes place the first weekend in August is also huge.

It is estimated that about 1 million people attend this event over the three-day weekend.

The festival is held at the Karl Marx Allee in the middle of Berlin, where it is hailed as having the longest beer garden in the world, and holds the official Guiness World Record for such.

After sampling some of the many, many beers (how would you even know where to start?), it's time for music and dancing. There are 18 stages for music, ranging from regional bands, covers, and *Schlager*, a type of European popular music focusing on love and feelings. Imagine what tons of people who have sampled some of the world's best beers would look like dancing until midnight each of the three days! I think it means tons of fun and *Gemütlichkeit*!

The second event is the *Elbjazz Festival*, which was organized in 2010 and takes place in June in Hamburg's port area. It offers jazz, blues, and soul along the Elb, and is one of the biggest jazz festivals in Germany. There are 50 international musical acts; something to appeal to everyone. The acts can be found on stages at unique and unusual venues in Hamburg's port area, from the shipyards to the majestic Elbphilharmonie Concert Hall, Hamburg's newest cultural landmark.

To add to the unique maritime festival, special launch boats transport festival attendees between the different venues. Imagine the ambiance of that! Wonderful and varied music along with beautiful views of a great port city. What a memorable adventure this would be! I'm ready, how about you?

I hope you enjoyed reading this month's "From the Editor," as much as I enjoyed researching these events and putting the huge amount of information into short written form for you.


