his month's topic is Father's Day, June 15. Father's Day is a celebration honoring fathers and celebrating fatherhood, paternal bonds, and the influence of fathers in society. Father's Day was founded at the YMCA in Spokane, Washington, in 1910 by Sonora Smart Dodd. The first cel-

ebration was in the Spokane YMCA on June 19, 1920. Her father, who was a Civil War veteran, was a single parent who raised six children. After hearing a sermon about Mother's Day in 1909, she told her pastor that fathers should also have a holiday to celebrate them.

A bill to accord national recognition of the holiday was introduced in Congress in 1913. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson went to Spokane to speak in a Father's Day celebration and wanted to make it official. But Congress resisted, fearing it would become commercialized (Imagine that!). President Calvin Coolidge recommended in 1924 that the day be observed by the nation, but a formal proclamation was not issued. After two earlier attempts to formally recognize the holiday were defeated in Congress, Maine Senator Margaret Chase Smith wrote a proposal in 1957 accusing Congress of ignoring fathers for forty years while honoring mothers. In 1966, President Lyndon Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, and designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Then, six years later, President Richard Nixon signed it into law. And you know the rest of the story: neckties, cookouts, etc.

Now, let's fast forward to Germany. In Germany, Father's Day (Vatertag) is celebrated on Ascension Day (the Thursday 40 days after Easter) and is a federal holiday. It is also called Men's Day (Männertag), or Gentlemen's Day (Herrentag). This is the day when the men get to do whatever they want. Many of the men pull their small wagons, Bollerwagen, filled with wine or beer, and have a great time sharing the day and having some great male bonding.

Regardless if a father is "new," or gay, single, or a traditional husband and provider: Father's Day is for all dads to celebrate.

So, however you want to celebrate with the fathers in your life, give them the recognition they deserve. And have fun!
