Gracie told the students about Christmas Eve in Austria and finally seeing the tree when the parlor door was opened. (That must have been real exciting!)

I told the story of the candy cane, and each student was given a candy cane when they were getting ready to leave the room. They also learned how to say Merry Christmas *auf Deutsch*.

The students listened and heard about German customs and traditions and sang a few carols, some in German. Klaus Raith brought his zither, and the students

really enjoyed watching him play and taking a look at an instrument they may never have heard of or seen before. By the time each group of students left the room, they had a candy cane in hand and *Frohe Weihnachten* on their lips.

Thank you Gracie and Klaus for continuing with me in this venture. It is a great way for the German American Society to reach out to the community.

The balls are usually opened by a Polonaise, which is a slow, stately dance of Polish origin. There are then speeches, a midnight quadrille (a sort of square dance performed by couples) and the crowning of the Belle of the Ball.

The most famous ball is the Viennese Opera Ball, where the members of high society, along with a crowd of high-society wannabees, dance and socialize the right way." (Are all the other wonderful balls the "wrong way"?)

There are sparkling balls held everywhere in Austria. Many balls are sponsored by professional groups ranging from confectioners to hunters, pharmacists, coffee house owners, and engineers. The ball season officially ends in February with an array of carnival balls (*Fasching* is near!). The balls go on until early morning, and it is said that if the Fairy Godmother was Austrian, she never would have dreamed of telling Cinderella she had to be home by midnight!
