




forces members both past and present for helping to maintain peace in our unsettled world and preserve our freedom. Please take advantage of **Veteran's Day**, 11/11, to say "Thank You" to a vet and thank him or her for their service. Actually, any time you see a vet is a good time to say thanks.

November also brings us **Thanksgiving**, when families and friends gather to give thanks for their many blessings and the opportunity to celebrate together and to watch a Thanksgiving Day Parade and football on TV. Also, please remember in your thoughts the many servicemen and -women who are separated from their families during Thanksgiving. May they be protected from harm and be able to return to their families very soon.

Now for a few words about a typical "Thanksgiving" in Germany. First of all, the Germanic *Erntedankfest* (harvest festival of thanks) is primarily a rural and a religious celebration. When it is celebrated in larger cities, it is usually part of a church service and not anything like the big traditional family holiday in America. Although it is celebrated locally and regionally, none of the German-speaking countries observes an official national Thanksgiving holiday on a particular day as in the U.S. However, during harvest time, visitors to German churches will find a large amount of fruits, vegetables, sheaves of grain, and also baked goods, as decorations around the altars. Visitors to market places and fairgrounds will oftentimes find *Erntefeuer* (harvest fire) and other festivities to celebrate *Erntedankfest*.

In the wine regions, *Winzer* (vintners) will present their new wines and allow for a public wine-tasting. (Yum!). A **Bauernmarkt** (farmers' market) will allow visitors to purchase the freshest produce available, while the more immediate culinary needs are attended to in a *Festzelt* (party tent), where various breads and sweet confections, as well as various *Würste* and other foods, and maybe some great German beers, would be available. For, after all, what is a German celebration without beer???


