March is special in Switzerland, where the first Sunday in March is *Tag der Kranken* (Day of the Ill). The Swiss observation started in 1939 when Dr. Marthe Nicati, who specialized in tuberculosis cases, felt that a day needed to be created to further better relations between the ill and the healthy. She also wanted to create a better understanding of the needs of the sick. This "Day of the Ill" is celebrated on the first Sunday in March with visits to hospitals, media awareness campaigns, and a speech by the Swiss Federal President. Each year has a theme to raise awareness and get people out to visit ill friends and family members.

Why don't we all observe this, not just for one day, but whenever we hear about a sick friend or family member? A card, phone call, or visit really cheers up an ill or recuperating person.

Spring is on its way and in Germany spring provides abundant sunshine and beautiful flowers. Cherry and apple blossoms line the historic German roads. People drive along the roads or sail down the rivers and canals to enjoy the wonderful castles, palaces, and medieval towns. Seats and tables begin to appear outside cafés, bistros, and ice cream parlors. And, of course, the beer gardens are set to go.

The cities, towns, and villages begin their spring celebrations, which range from music to wine and cheese, and a lot more merrymaking. *Frühjahrsmüdigkeit* (spring tiredness) is banned. As usual, the Germans know how to get things rolling! Happy Spring!


