pring is here, so let's take an imaginary trip through beautiful Germany. The weather in Germany can be unpredictable. The weather in April may change from sun to rain or hail showers in a couple of hours. So bring those layers, waterproof shoes, a scarf, and pack wet-weather gear. The average temperature is going to be between 39 and 47 degrees, depending on where we go, so be prepared.

We have landed in Frankfurt, so let's attend its annual spring festival, or Dippemess. It is one of the largest folk festivals in the Rhine region. The fair dates back to the 14th century when it was a medieval market for pottery. We can shop for ceramic bowls and pots (called *dibbes* in the Frankfurt dialect). And of course, Munich. Munich may be most famous for its fall Oktoberfest, but the springtime Frühlingsfest is a city-wide party which is lovingly known as "the little sister of Oktoberfest." The Munich Spring Fair is a two-week event that brings out the entire city to celebrate the warming weather and blossoming flowers. Just as with Oktoberfest, local beers are one of the highlights of the festival, and we can be assured that there will be plenty to enjoy. (Another hooray!!!)

Time to head back to the airport and home. We had so much imaginary fun that it almost felt real!
