From the Editor

Did you ever wonder where Ground Hog Day originated? Not really, huh! Well, I'm going to tell you anyway. Yep, you guessed it: Germany!

This tradition was brought to Pennsylvania by German immigrants. February 2 is Candlemas Day, the day when a candlelit mass was held to brighten up the dark days of winter. The clergy would distribute candles to all the parishioners, and the event became an important date

on the calendar, when people took particular note of the weather. They also inventoried all the supplies on hand to get them through the winter.

Here's a verse about the event:

*Wenn's an Lichmess stürmt und schneit
Ist der Frühling nicht mehr weit;
Ist es aber klar and hell,
Kommt der Lenz noch nicht so schnell.*

*When it storms and snows on Candlemas Day,
Spring is not far away,
If it's bright and clear;
Spring is not yet near.*

The custom developed by looking for signs of spring or the continuation of winter. If a hedgehog (originally a bear), cast its shadow, there would be six more weeks of winter. But if it was a cloudy day without shadows, winter would be much shorter. So, enter the groundhog, and the German tradition became Americanized. This is just one more way to show the influence of German traditions on the American way of life. Now you have something new with which to amaze your friends over a couple of cold ones!

Now, about Valentine's Day: Valentinstag has only been celebrated in Germany since World War II. In Germany, it's an adults-only holiday, so you won't see any of those cute little pink or red "Be Mine" cards that the American children exchange in school. The German cards are strictly meant for adults, and the chocolates that accompany them can be quite provocative. The Germans also put a little twist on Valentine's Day by adding a pig to their cards. These little pigs are a symbol of luck, but also of lust. So, for extra luck with the loved one or a would-be Valentine, some cards have little pigs holding a four-leaf clover while climbing a ladder on a heart.
